

SCULTHORPE MESSENGER HISTORY

The village magazine was started in September 1987 and was called 'The Parish Tower'. Initially it was organised by the church and had a picture of the church as its front page. We had a small number of typists in the village who took turns to do the typing. David Beale and I and 1 or 2 others used the Gestetner in the church to print the A4 pages which Anne Lingwood stapled together.

Printing was laborious and messy and loading the black ink was quite a skill. Volunteers around the village put a copy in each door. Some years later I could use a computer to do a hard copy to take to the school to print off 260 copies and at some stage Ron Wells used his printer to make the copies. These then went to Anne Lingwood and Jean Edge to be folded and given to the distributors

After 25 years Pippa Goreman took over as editor, to be followed by Jonathan Stroulger until recently. Thank you, Alex, for continuing this facility.

NEWS FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL

As many of you will be aware, work is now well underway to transform Blacketts Pond into a family friendly space to be used by all. Please be assured that the works are still in progress and what you are presently seeing is not the finished article.

We understand that some residents were unaware of the proposed plans for the redevelopment of Blacketts Pond, however, this subject has been covered at almost every Parish Council meeting since early 2020 and has had input from outside agencies, such as the Norfolk Wildlife Trust, to ensure the works are as sympathetic to wildlife and biodiversity as possible.

We welcome as many residents as possible to join in with the Parish Council meetings so that your voices can all be heard. If you are unable to attend in person, the meeting minutes are publicly available. If you read something that you wish to discuss with the Parish Council further, please do not hesitate to get in touch.

With regards to the timings of the pond works, we were led by the contractor and the Norfolk Wildlife Trust on this. Works needed to be completed during the winter period to allow sufficient time for things to settle, in time for the new spring growth.

In other news, NNDC are changing the bin collection days. They have stated that every resident should receive a leaflet from them by the 28th of March detailing the new changes. If

you do not receive anything from them, please speak with a neighbour, check the NNDC website or give them a call.


