WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?

Over the last month PC Pegden has been out with the IFCA conducting patrols along the coast from Wells to Blakeney. He has also conducted high visibility patrols in the RIB outside of Wells down to Brancaster Staithe.

Meetings have taken place with the RNLI to discuss joint working and training arrangements. As well as the Wells Safety Meeting with RNLI, Coastguards, Lifeguards, Coastwatch and Holkham.

PC Pegden has been hosting Engagement Surgeries at Wells Police Station along with volunteer Malcom Pearson. The next one is 8th December 2021. This gives you an opportunity to pop along and discuss any issues or concerns you may have and to receive crime prevention advice. PC Pegden also had a successful pop up event at Walsingham Village at the Old Museum with PC Blakeley.

High visibility patrols have been carried out in Wells town as part of the Problem Solving Plan.

CRIME UPDATES (1st to 31st October)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	1	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business and community	1	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	0	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	0	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	1	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	0	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
