

Sculthorpe Parish Council Meeting Minutes

Wednesday 2 November 2022 at 7pm, Village Hall

Parish Councillors present: Tony Walters (Vice Chair), Penny Ramm, Gillian White (from item 8.4), Simon Read, Ken Dawson. Also in attendance: Jodie Bond (Parish Clerk). There were no members of the public present.

1. Welcome and to receive apologies for absence

The Vice Chairman welcomed those present.

Apologies received from Brian Watkin (Chairman), Roger London, Tom FitzPatrick (District Councillor). Apologies accepted.

2. Receive declarations of interest and requests for dispensations by Councillors

Cllr Ramm declared a pecuniary interest in item 9.1. It was agreed that Cllr Ramm would abstain from participation in item 9.1.

3. Minutes of meeting held on 7 September 2022 to be approved

The minutes were approved without amendment and signed by the Vice Chairman as a correct record.

4. To report progress on items not on the agenda from the last meeting

Clerk reported that the electricity company are unable to provide a forecast or estimated electricity bill for the coming year, at this time. Also, NNDC Planning Department has acknowledged the emails sent regarding the conditions for car parking spaces at Dels. Update to follow.

6. Open forum for Public Participation: an opportunity to hear from members of the public

There were none.

7. To receive updates from council members (for information only)

7.1 Speed Watch report

Cllr London reported that the team did 4 sessions last month and had no one speeding. This month they will be doing 3 extra sessions, as from the 14th - 20th it is National Road Safety Week.

7.2 Village Hall Committee report

Cllr Ramm reported that the committee has agreed to increase the hire rate for business users, but members of the public will remain the same.

The committee has also requested the help of the Parish Council again, to obtain quotes for a new roof. Clerk to make enquiries.

7.3 Receive report on school's use of playing field

Cllr Read met with the new Executive Head Teacher and advised that the school has free use of the playing field, but a small financial donation is made each year to help with the maintenance and grass cutting costs. They were unaware of the agreement to use the playing field. Clerk to forward an agreement / waiver in writing to the school.

Cllr Walters reminded the Council that The Francis Beckham trust owns the playing field and boundary fencing and therefore has the responsibility for any issues with it.

8. Open Spaces

Playing Field

Clllr Read reported that while carrying out a visual check he noticed there was some wear and tear damage on the ramp on the main climbing frame and the bottom rung on the ramp has snapped. Council AGREED to go ahead with necessary repairs or replacement work. Clerk to send photos to NGF Play for confirmation of cost.

Overgrown Hedge

It was noted that a recurring issue with an overgrown hedge from a property in Moor Lane has still not been resolved. Clerk to ask Highways to intervene. Clerk to also ask whether Highways will clear escaped gravel from the pavement.

8.1 Blacketts pond area update

The amended work schedule and estimate was received today. Clerk to forward this to the grant panel for further consideration.

8.2 Consider safety matting quotations

Clerk presented the quotations for the softbond matting received from NGF Play Ltd. The quote includes a breakdown of costs per item of play equipment. The overall cost, if all items of equipment were to receive the matting, would cost £22610 plus VAT. It was agreed to keep this on file and consider one item at a time as a project in the future.

8.3 Receive update on bus shelter panels

Fakenham Glass has quoted £80 to switch the existing panel or £180 if the panel has to be replaced. Clerk has given the go ahead following approval from the Council.

8.4 To consider quotations for grass cutting and pest control for 2023

Two quotations had been received. One from CGM Ltd and another from EG Care. Following discussion, the Council RESOLVED to accept the quotation from EG Care for £1456 plus VAT, subject to confirmation of the inclusion of the path near the allotments.

Cllr Walters noted that CGM Ltd has provided a good service in the past.

It was agreed to consider the pest control renewal at the next meeting.
