









News from Sculthorpe Parish Church

Hello all, it is probably a little late in the day to wish you all a Happy New Year but I will anyway!

Hopefully life will defy the pundits and we will get through 2023 more easily than expected.

Thank you to David and Sue, and I think, their sons, for decorating the Christmas tree once again. It really cheered the Church up for the Carols and readings. John Johnson came up trumps too and the Church looked fabulous every evening illuminated by his lighting. St Mary and All Saints had help from many people throughout the past year so thank you to all of you. We couldn't do it without you.

There is a lot of consternation in the Church at the moment. Many of you will have heard in the media that the big Church (as opposed to Parish Churches such as ours) is going to use £150 million to fund projects around the world to make reparation for the part played by, presumably the Church, during the Slave Trade. Whilst most involved in the work of the Church feel this may make a positive difference to the lives of those in the targeted areas, it can be difficult to understand how this money has been found.

Over several years, the number of Parish Clergy has reduced considerably whilst the role of administrators has increased. The effect that this has had on Parishes is considerable. More Churches per vicar means less value to each Community and this is likely to get worse.

The administration costs go up and up so not only do the individual Churches have to find more money, simply to keep their Churches going, the diocese asks each benefice for more money each year to cover the shortfall so a no win situation

Our very small PCC will continue, however, to try and raise some funds again this year to help towards our costs of running our church. I would like to assure all of you that the money you donate or help us raise goes to pay the running costs of the building including the heating, the insurance etc. Barry and Shaun are our only paid help and they do a great job of keeping the grass cut and the whole area tidy.

We do have some money in the Churchyard fund but this is a restricted account so we cannot use the funds for anything other than the churchyard. It is the only healthy account that we have.

We have a big expense this year so we need to use some more of the legacy that we were left to repair the west wall. This means that we probably have 2 or 3 years before it runs out completely. Fingers crossed that the boiler keeps going!

We do need a new treasurer, it isn't a very onerous task and I, who hate bookwork, have managed to keep on top of it for about 10 years. Unfortunately the end of the year coincides with other commitments that I have and it has made it difficult for me to do what I want to. If there is anyone in the village who would take it on then please contact me and I will explain what it involves.

News from Sculthorpe Parish Council

Your parish needs you!!

The parish council is a small team of volunteers that meets every other month. The meetings last a couple of hours starting at 7.00 p.m.on the first Wednesday of alternate months. If you are interested in helping to improve the village in any way, you might like to consider joining us. We have a limited budget which is a part of the council tax collected by NNDC and for certain projects we can get extra funds from grants which have enabled us, over the last few years to replace the play equipment in the children's play area change the street lighting from sodium lamps to l.e.d. lighting which is less expensive and more ecologically friendly to run and gives a brighter light and to install a defibrillator on the wall of the village hall amongst other things. We are awaiting approval (and funding) to improve the pond and install picnic benches on the adjacent grassed area on Creake Rd.

Our budget includes, amongst other things, funding to maintain the grassed areas around the village

(including the play area) and to pay for the street lighting around the village (not including the lights in Foundry Close!!). We have a close liaison with NNDC highways dept. to get pot holes in the road repaired and our objective is to make Sculthorpe a nice place to live.

If you would like to consider joining the team please will you contact me on 01328 258268 or e mail me at brian@theoldwashhouse.com or our parish clerk (Jodie) at Sculthorpepc@gmail.com to express an interest. You need to be over 18, ideally to live in the village (although strangely that isn't essential), and to want to help improve the village to the advantage of all the villagers. Formal training will be offered so that you know what is and isn't legally required of the parish councillors. None of our councillors are, currently, formally affiliated to any political party, merely having a desire to make the village a pleasant place to live.
