

### NEWS FROM SCULTHORPE PARISH CHURCH

Hello to you all,

Autumn is well and truly here now; I hope you are all ready for the colder weather and the darker nights.

I have tried not to mention the Church finances for a while now, but we have just had the boiler serviced and it has sent me back to my role as head prefect. The news isn't good, and we are hoping that it will make it through this year. When not if it fails at any point we have come to the stage, financially, when we won't be able to replace it. We are now, officially, quite poor. I have been warning you all of this for quite a few years now and, unfortunately, nothing has happened to stop the outflow of funds, and we will struggle to pay our way.

We have already stopped paying our part of the Parish Share. This is the money we are asked to pay to the Diocese to fund the work they do in supporting the Parishes. This impacts on us in a negative way and means that we probably won't be eligible for a replacement vicar if/when Father Clive retires. At the moment Father Clive, as Rural Dean, has had to take on responsibility for an extra benefice, bringing the total number of churches under his wing to 14! This obviously impacts on the time he has available to devote to his own Benefice.

This may not concern you at all, in which case please turn the page. If it does concern you and you would like to help the Church survive then **please contact one of us**. You don't have to join the PCC or take on any great responsibility, but any help/ideas are welcome. Skills in obtaining grants would be very very welcome!

Sadly, we are losing two of our church openers. We do get a steady stream of visitors to the church, some come to look at the font, some to see our lovely stained glass, some just to sit and be quiet, so it is nice for the church to be accessible. Gary and Mary have been opening the church for the last few years and it is much appreciated. We wish them well in their new home. They are a hard act to follow but if you could help us to keep the building open please contact us. Many of you walk your dogs around the village in the morning, perhaps you wouldn't mind a little detour once or twice a week? We do stand in for one another so you can still go on holiday.

Thank you to Ruth who put the piece about the tapestry behind the Altar in the Messenger last month and thank you to her daughter who was responsible for putting it there. It's one of those nuggets of information that shouldn't be lost. I will get around to typing the story out and putting in near the tapestry soon.

We have quite a busy couple of months coming up- apart from our usual evensong services on the third Sunday in the month at 5pm there will be a Service of Remembrance on the 11th of November at 10.45am. This is being organised by Sculthorpe Academy but is, of course, open to all.

In December the school is in action again and is holding its **Nativity on the 10th at 2pm.** with their **Christingle service on the 19th.** 

On Sunday the 15th of December the Coastal Vocals are having a Christmas Concert at 6pm. Their last concert was so good that you shouldn't miss this one.




