News from Sculthorpe Parish Council

The parish council have had the village registered a 'No cold calls' village and it has significantly reduced the number of door knock salespeople but we have a supply of "DO NOT KNOCK" stickers which can be fixed to your door and if you would like one for yourself, a neighbour or a relative you can collect one at the village meeting.

I'd also like to draw you attention to the risk of being caught out by scammers who are getting more and more clever at emptying the bank accounts of the elderly. They can approach you and your neighbours either by e mail, phone or by post and it's reckoned that 53% of people over 65 have been targeted. Believe me when I say that they are good at doing what they do and so if you or a relative have been approached and asked to keep a mailing secret, reply or respond urgently, send money to claim a prize that you have "won", or asked for personal details then you have probably been scammed. A recent scam has been to ask, by phone, for you to hang up and immediately phone your bank on the banks number shown on your statement or debit card as you are at risk of being robbed and you will be asked by the bank to do a transfer of your funds to prevent the theft. They claim to be the police or the fraud squad or the fraud dept of you bank. Actually what happens is that by some trickery your phone call is being intercepted by the thieves and you will be guided to transfer the funds into their account. If you are asked to make an immediate phone call, the best advice we can give is to hang up, leave it at least 30 minutes, then speak to the bank and advise them of what has happened and DON'T transfer any funds anywhere.

So be careful, talk to elderly neighbours and relatives and hopefully we can stop scammers.

I'd like to remind you about the annual village meeting which takes place this year on Wednesday May 4th at 6.30pm in the village hall. We will be hearing from Mr Robert Smith who lives in the village and is the harbour master at Wells. I regularly walk from the harbour down to the lifeboat station and have wondered how it all works to keep it all under control and why is the route out into open water so bendy? So if you have your own questions come along to the meeting and find out the answers from the boss! It also give you the opportunity to ask your parish councillors any questions about their role in making the village tick and to make any suggestions for facilities or improvements that you would like to see around it.

The meeting will be followed by the regular parish council meeting and you will be welcome to stay and meet your parish councillors. However we won't be offended if you choose to leave before the council meeting starts.
